## **Conduct**

- Players and team officials must at all times accept the umpire's decision.
- •Players must not show dissent at the umpire's decision or react in a provocative or disapproving manner towards another player or a spectator.
- •Players and team officials shall not intimidate, assault or attempt to intimidate or assault an umpire, another player, a Club official or a spectator.
- Players and team officials shall not use crude or foul and abusive language, nor make comments (known as "sledging"), nor make offensive gestures or hand signals, nor deliberately distract an opponent.

## **Donald Carver Memorial Day**

One season on from the passing of Donald Carver, WMCC paid tribute to his life and legacy in the annual memorial cup. With the appearance of friends old and new, the two captains Cameron Hayman and George Verlander drew up teams and went out to investigate the wicket. Calling heads on the toss Hayman elected to bat first, despite the wicket damp from the previous night's showers. However, despite this disadvantage, the bowling side were the ones soon leaking runs. After a quick dismissal of R. Tripathi, R. Barnard trudged to the crease to meet J. Preston. The two were in fine form, with strokes placed to all corners of the boundary. The pair soon arrived back in the pavilion retired. C. Hayman and N. Costin were not far behind them, both playing superbly on Woodham's sticky track. However, the wickets of D. Glasson, G. Cook and N. Goode fell in quick succession, pulling the run rate down and giving some breathing space to the fielders. Dallinger returned to hero's welcome, bowling his mystical 'chuck-ball' that nearly got the better of a returning J. Preston, until he was bowled, along with Mitchell, who clipped behind to Verlander's offspin to a bewildered Co. Hayman keeping. 156-6 set off the first 20 overs.

Goode's pace on 3, bringing to the wicket the ever reliable N. Cook, who provided the stand out performance of the batting team. With wickets falling all around him N. Cook smashed boundaries all over Pheasant Park, whilst the wickets of G. Verlander, M. Grundy and S. Collis were taken cheaply. With a late cameo N. Cook was joined at the crease by S. Older who too reached the retirement score of 25 in a prompt manner. Alas, the loss of cheap wickets proved fatal to Verlander's men and although few provided solid displays between the stumps the total was just too far out of reach in the concluding overs. 142-5 off 20 overs.
